Mr Stephen McGowan, Messrs TLT LLP was present representing the applicant, Mr White, Director was in attendance.

Ms Sinclair advised Police Scotland submitted a representation to the application and read the contents of same to the Board which included the request for additional conditions to be placed on the licence, if granted.

Sergeant Robertson intimated that he had nothing further to add to the terms of the representation.

Mr McGowan addressed the Board providing information to Members on the operation of the premises and confirmed agreement to the additional conditions within the Police representation. He confirmed that the standard conditions within the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 pertaining to Late Opening Premises will apply to the premises. Mr McGowan referred to the additional condition requesting an appropriate number of SIA stewards to be employed whilst the premises are operating, explaining that it will be based on a risk assessment being carried out for each event and not a set number of Stewards at all times.

Ms Dillon had no comments to make on the application.

After a private discussion of Members, upon returning to the public session, Councillor McEleny moved grant of the application with the additional condition which was unanimously agreed.
