	Independent living services provides support for all groups living with a physical disability. Any saving proposal within this service has the potential to negatively impact on the users of the service. However, the scope of the review and phasing over 25/26 and 26/27 financial years will seek to minimise the impact by considering the skill mix required to deliver statutory responsibilities. There is a need to maximise opportunities from our integrated facilities within our Health Centres, particularly Greenock, hence the move



away from home visits to appointments at the Health centre.

The service requires a redesign to consider efficiencies in the delivery of services particularly small equipment and adaptations. There will be a review of all support provided to physical disabled people to ensure that we are maximising our technology enabled care.

We need to adopt more of the principles of selfassessment, recognising the user is the expert of their own life. Their abilities and capacity should support increasing self-efficiency and promotes independence.

Any negative impacts during the period of transition of services will be carefully managed in consultation with staff, service users, family and carers over the course of the review.

The review of services will deliver more effective ways of working, maximising staff skill mix and maximising opportunities for service users ensuring access for the most up to date developments in technology, of integrated facilities including Health Centres and latest best practice are implemented. At this stage the individual impacts are not



known and will be monitored closely as the review progresses. Current ways of working are outdated and cannot be sustained moving forward. Any changes will seek to modernise the service with the goal of minimising impact overall for our service users by exploring the best alternatives available. We will also focus on a more participative and collaborative approach through self-assessment. We will move forward to a more targeted approach focussing on complexity and vision.

The Occupational therapy service is key to deliver the Maximising Independence approach which is embedded throughout the HSCP strategic plan. This review will seek to modernise services through use of new technology, structure review and maximising opportunities through the best use of integrated services and better use of facilities/properties. At this stage the individual impacts are not known and will be monitored closely as the review progresses. The service will also become more targeted in influencing and shaping the capacity of all the workforce to maximise independence.

Consultation/engagement	Will be part of overall budget consultation and stakeholders will be consulted as the review progresses.
Research	Demand analysis of referrals to the service and the complexity of the work. Data analysis on the demands around adaptation assessments, Blue Badge assessments and urgent moving and handling assessments and provision of equipment and assessments that support hospital discharges.
Officers' knowledge and experience (including feedback from frontline staff)	Knowledge in relation to national policy around supporting people with frailty and complex disabilities. The service is instrumental to the Unscheduled care work within the area and holds data around number of admissions to hospital prevented. This knowledge will be taken into account as the redesign progresses.
Equalities monitoring data	Caseload monitoring around levels of frailty, age of referrers etc.
User feedback (including complaints)	The service receives a high level of Cllr enquiries, enquiries complaints (normally resolved at level 1) and FOI's.
Stakeholders Other	Housing providers- Housing assessments that support housing provision for all ages.  Care at home service – All moving and Handling training within the HSCP is covered by the Occupational Therapy team as well as training staff on reablement.
