	Reduction of contributions to Financial Fitness, Starter Packs and Homestart in 25/26 financial year.
	These services provide support to a range of protected groups including children & young people, older people, people with disabilities, carers and those in financial difficulty.
	Arrangements for Homestart will be included in an alternative contract being arranged via Children and Families service.
	Financial Fitness provide welfare benefits, debt and money advice and supports a range



of individuals in Inverclyde. The impact on these groups will be minimised over a period by consideration of use of reserves and alternative funding in the early adoption of this proposal. This will also be part of the redesign of our front door.

Starter Packs – this service provides access to a range of household items to those who are setting up in a new home (pots, pans, bedlinen etc) within various groups including young people moving out of care, new Scots and those from our most deprived communities. Removing the use of starter packs would impact negatively, however use of one-off reserves and alternative funding would be explored to minimise the overall impact.
