These measures could have a negative effect on service users as providers are expected to reduce costs. It is difficult to identify exactly the groups which may be affected at this stage.

Although this efficiency is primarily in relation to commissioning arrangements, a large number of contracts have recently been commissioned for a period of above 1 year, therefore it may prove difficult to meet from the remaining contracts, resulting in the need to explore renegotiating current contracts or reducing the services within them.

It is envisaged that the impact to all groups can be minimised through close working with providers with a view to doing things differently and re-enforcing continuous review and monitoring of services and contracts in place.
