

Walk on Wednesdays

Competition Rules

1. By swiping your WalkingFob you are agreeing to the rules of the Competition.
2. The Competition is available to all pupils who go to school in the area in which the Competition is running. The areas where the Competition is taking place are advertised by the schools taking part in the Competition.
3. Players should practice caution and sensible road safety. The game has similar risks as walking, scooting, cycling or playing outdoors.
4. Players should exercise the same caution that they would do when travelling to school or around their local area for any outdoor activity.
5. Players agree to play in a sensible manner and respecting the rights and safety of other people as they would when carrying out any outdoor activities. Inverclyde Council accepts no liability for any loss or damage resulting, directly or indirectly, from taking part in the Competition.
6. The Competition runs from the 04 September 2024 to the 11 December 2024. The WalkBoxes are available on Wednesdays of school weeks between 7am and 10am on the approaches to schools at locations advertised by schools.
7. Players must swipe the WalkBox to gain 10 points. Only one swipe is necessary to register points. Any extra swipe on the same day will not be counted. To be eligible for the prizes, a player must have swiped on the box at least 6 times, of which at least two swipes need to be consecutive (two weeks in a row).
8. Prizes will be handed to the owner of the WalkFob with the highest number of points and, in the event more payers have the same number of points – the winner of the prize will be chosen randomly from the highest scoring players. To collect the prize – the winning WalkFob will have to be presented to the school.
9. Occasionally WalkBoxes may be broken. In such case you may use another WalkBox in your vicinity to register your walk to school. In the event that a player misses out on points due to a WalkBox being broken, we unfortunately cannot add points retrospectively to a player's account – we cannot award points deemed to be lost from nonfunctioning WalkBoxes. Should there be a problem with one of the WalkBoxes please email roads@inverclyde.gov.uk and we will attend to it at the earliest opportunity.

The only data we collect is the WalkFob number and the date and time it has been registered at a WalkBox.
