Mr S McGowan, TLT was present representing the applicant. Mr J White, Director, Ms P Cannon, Designated Premises Manager and Mr A Wilson, Door Steward were in attendance.

Mr Douglas advised the Board that Strathclyde Police had requested review of the Premises Licence at Harwoods, 208 Dalrymple Street, Greenock and read the letter dated 7 March 2013 from the Chief Superintendent. The letter also requested the Board to consider which steps it deems necessary or appropriate in relation to the Personal Licence Holder, Ms P Cannon.

The Board heard Sergeant MacKinnon in support of their review.

The Board heard Mr McGowan in support of the licence holder and lodged various documentation in support of his submissions. He advised that an Action Plan has been compiled and will be implemented with immediate effect and asked the Board to consider continuation of the review for a period of 3 months in order to show Members the positive effects of the Action Plan over this period.

After discussion, the Board agreed:-

- (i) the grounds for review of Personal Licence held by Ms Cannon were not met and no action be taken;
- (ii) grounds for review were met with regard to the Premises Licence. The 3 months trial period for the Action Plan to be implemented was not necessary, however note the voluntary steps taken by the licence holder; and
- (iii) a written warning be given to the licence holder.
