- (iii) No other changes to be adopted.

#### **Decision Comments Received**

Mr Douglas advised the Beer and Pub Association request the Board to consider later opening of those premises not providing "significant entertainment" and the wording "significant entertainment should be removed.

There followed a full discussion after which, Councillor McEleny moved that premises offering no significant entertainment the terminal hour be increased on a Friday and Saturday evening to 1.30 a.m. As an amendment Provost Moran moved no change to the existing Policy. On a role call vote, 3 Members (Provost Moran, Councillor Ahlfeld and Brennan) voted for the amendment, 4 Members (Councillor McEleny, Campbell-Sturgess, Shepherd and Wilson) voted for the motion which was declared carried and 1 Member (Councillor Loughran) abstained.

Councillor McEleny also moved that premises offering significant entertainment facilities and subject to conditions the Board may impose e.g. Nightclubs the terminal hour be increased on a Friday and Saturday evening to 3.30 a.m. with bar to close at 3.00 a.m. As an amendment Provost Moran moved no change to the existing Policy. On a role call vote, 3 Members (Provost Moran, Councillor Ahlfeld and Brennan) voted for the amendment, 4 Members (Councillor McEleny, Campbell-Sturgess, Shepherd and Wilson) voted for the motion which was declared carried and 1 Member (Councillor Loughran) abstained.

Mr Douglas confirmed the decision of the Board:-

- to increase the terminal hour on Friday and Saturday evening to 1.30 a.m. in (i) respect of premises offering no significant entertainment; and
- to increase the terminal hour on Friday and Saturday evening to 3.30 a.m. (bar (ii) to close 3.00 a.m.) in respect of premises offering significant entertainment e.g. Niahtclubs.
