Inverclyde Performance Report

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Local Fire and Rescue Service Plan Priorities

The Local Fire and Rescue Service Plan has been developed to set out the priorities and objectives within Inverceyde and allows our local authority partners to scrutinise the performance outcomes of these priorities. We will continue to work closely with our partners in Inverceyde to ensure we are all **"Working Together for a Safer Scotland**" through targeting risks to our communities at a local level.

The plan has been developed to complement key partnership activity embedded across Inverclyde Community Plan and associated Delivery and Thematic plans. Through partnership working we will seek to deliver continuous improvement in our performance and effective service delivery in our area of operations.

The Local Fire and Rescue Plan for Inverclyde identified six areas for demand reduction and is subject to regular monitoring and reporting through the Police / Fire and Rescue Committee. A summary of the priorities and current activity is detailed below with further detail and analysis contained within this performance report.

About the statistics within this report




Activity levels have increased overall

Inverclyde Activity Summary






Activity by Time of Day




Incidents by Classification








Domestic Safety - Accidental Dwelling Fires





A decrease when compared to the same period last year. A high percentage of calls still being made through linked alarms which is positive. SFRS will continue to support the Scottish Government's new detector standard and promote the benefits to all households.




A slight increase in the number of casualties over this period. Committee will note the percentage of casualties requiring hospital treatment (80%/4 people), however, early warning of fire is key in preventing the outcome becoming more serious. SFRS continues to deliver its Home Fire Safety Visit programme and works with partners to identify those most in need.

Unintentional Injury and Harm











structures or any fire involving casualties, rescues or fires attended by five or more appliances

<u>Secondary Fires</u> – fire incidents that did not occur at a primary location, was not a chimney fire in an occupied building, did not involve casualties (otherwise categorised as a primary incident) and was attended by four or fewer appliances.

Deliberate Fires by Time of Day




Deliberate Fires by Classification





Deliberate Fires Compared to Operational Activity




An increase in deliberate fires over this period, however this is set against a reduction in primary fire percentage. SFRS continues to play a full part in the Community Hub Meetings with our partners on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays to highlight trend or increased activity areas for action.

Non Domestic Fire Safety



A decrease in damage caused by heat and smoke with an increase in direct firefighting this will be due to the nature of some incidents. Our Protection officers will continue to support local businesses through our Fire Safety Audit Programme both pre and post fire.

Unwanted Fire Alarm Signals



A similar data set when compared to the same period last year in terms of demand. The property types for UFAS remain consistent with some seasonal fluctuation (educational lower than usual). SFRS has begun a wider consultation 'Time for Change' which will look to reduce demand in terms of our response to UFAS incidents and realise benefits for SFRS and businesses across our communities.
