As an amendment Councillor J McEleny moved acceptance of the recommendations with the administration amendment of recommendation 3.1 in that it should refer to Section 7.10 and not 7.9 of the draft policy. Ms Sinclair confirmed amendment of the recommendation in 3.1 and all Members agreed the recommendations, as amended.
