Subject: Public Space CCTV Update

### 1.0 PURPOSE AND SUMMARY

- 1.2 To update Committee on the Public Space CCTV System.
- 1.3 Members will be aware of the historical performance issues around the Public Space CCTV system from previous reports and verbal updates to this Committee. Following the agreement of the 2024-2026 budget a new contractor was appointed and upgrades carried out to the hardware and software.
- 1.4 The Public Space CCTV system is now functioning well, and we will shortly be issuing invites to members of the Committee to visit the CCTV suite to see the system in operation.

#### 3.0 BACKGROUND AND CONTEXT

- 3.1 Members were informed about concerns about the reliability of the Public Space CCTV System and issues with the contractor at the time in reports to this Committee and subsequent verbal updates. The system is now up and running, with 44 fixed cameras, 5 re-deployable cameras and 3 mobile cameras in the wardens' vans. At the time of writing one of the fixed cameras was awaiting the commissioning of a new pole. The service is confident that the new contractual arrangement will provide far better resilience than that experienced more recently.
- 3.2 The 5 re-deployable cameras will give greater flexibility in responding to issues in areas with no fixed cameras. At present 3 of these cameras are in use in Clune Park to improve coverage following the fire-raising incidents over recent months. These cameras also supply invaluable intelligence on people potentially putting themselves at risk by accessing unsafe buildings.
- 3.3 The three cameras on the wardens' vans provide additional coverage for events and incidents including both organised events and ad hoc gatherings.
