488 Modernising Planning Appeals: Scottish Government Consultation

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There was submitted a report by the Corporate Director Environment & Community Protection (1) on proposed changes to the system of processing planning appeals in Scotland and (2) advising of the response submitted to the Scottish Government on the Modernising Planning Appeals consultation paper, a copy which was appended to the report.

(Councillor Clocherty entered the meeting during consideration of this item of business). **Decided:** that the Committee endorse the consultation response to the Scottish Government on the Modernising Planning Appeals consultation paper.
