Subject: General Fund Revenue Budget 2008/9 – Position as at 31 January 2009

#### 1.0 PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of the report to advise Committee of the position of the 2008/9 General Fund revenue budget as at 31 January 2009, and to provide an update on the position in respect of General Fund reserves and designated earmarked reserves.

#### 2.0 SUMMARY

- 2.1 Appendix 1 shows that at 31 January 2009 the 2008/9 budget is projecting an underspend of £1.647 million. This is an improvement of £43,000 since the last report.
- 2.2 Appendix 1 shows that of the five Service Committees, three are projecting underspends, one is projecting a break even, whilst Health & Social Care is projecting an overspend due to increased childcare costs arising over the Christmas period.
- 2.3 Appendix 2 gives the current position of earmarked reserves which shows expenditure being 62% of projected 2008/9 spend. The position in respect of earmarked reserves is reported to the CMT each month, and relevant Officers have reviewed phasings reported to Committee.
- 2.4 Appendix 3 shows that the General Fund reserve is projected to be £9 million as at 31 March 2009. Members took decisions in respect of the use of the General Fund reserves as part of the 2009/11 budget process, and latest projections are in line with the figures provided at that time.
- 2.5 In line with previous financial years, the Chief Financial Officer will review the designation and level of earmarked reserves as part of the 2008/9 closure process.

#### 3.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.1 It is recommended that the Committee note the current position of the General Fund revenue budget for 2008/9.
- 3.2 It is recommended that the Committee note the position in respect of the General Fund reserves and the associated earmarked reserves.
- 3.3 It is recommended that the Committee delegate to the Chief Financial Officer to determine the number and value of the earmarked reserves as part of the year end accounts process.

#### 4.0 BACKGROUND

4.1 The Council agreed the 2008/9 Revenue Budget in February 2008. At the same time the Council agreed the General Fund reserves strategy, and in April 2008 the Council agreed its initial Financial Strategy which was further reviewed in November 2008.

#### 5.0 2008/9 CURRENT POSITION

- 5.1 Appendix 1 shows that the current underspend for 2008/9 is £1.647 million (0.9% of turnover). This is an improvement of £43,000 since the last report.
- 5.2 The position in respect of each Committee is as follows.

## **Education & Lifelong Learning**

Projecting to outturn on budget following the identification of various one-off savings by the Corporate Director.

#### Social Care

Projecting £111,000 overspend at period 9. The overspend is entirely due to projected overspend in Residential Childcare, plus adoption/fostering costs arising from placements made over the December/January period. Whilst every effort is being made to contain this overspend within the Health & Social Care Committee bottom line it must be recognised that given the limited time left in 2008/9, there is a strong possibility that Social Work will overspend marginally in 2008/9.

## Safe & Sustainable Communities

Projecting a £172,000 underspend. This significant improvement from the last report is largely down to improvements in projected planning fee income.

## Regeneration

Projecting an underspend of £41,000.

#### Policy & Resources

Projecting a net underspend of £376,000 arising from part year saving £170,000 relating to the new corporate insurance contract, allied to reductions in net benefit costs.

5.3 It should be noted that the above Committee positions are before the allocation of increased electricity and gas costs projected to be £520,000 more than the approved budget. These sums will be required to be allocated out as part of the year end accounts closure process.

## 6.0 EARMARKED RESERVES

- 6.1 It can be seen from Appendix 2 that the earmarked reserve balance at 31 March 2008 is £10.203 million. New funding of £13.336 million has been added in 2008/9, with projected spend being £17.120 million. To date spend is £10.625 million, being 62% of projected spend in 2008/9.
- 6.2 The position of all earmarked reserves is reviewed by relevant Lead Officers and the CMT on a monthly basis, and projections reflect their latest input.

6.3 As in previous years, it is proposed that as part of the account's closure process that Committee delegate to the Chief Financial Officer to determine the number and level of resources for all earmarked reserves. The Council has successfully utilised earmarked reserves over the past few years to smooth out costs in relation to the delivery of key corporate policy issues, and it is recommended that this practice continues.

#### 7.0 GENERAL FUND RESERVES

7.1 Appendix 3 shows the latest projection position in respect of the General Fund reserve. The projected balance as at 31 March 2009 is £9.006 million. This is £5.006 million in excess of the recommended minimum approved by Committee as part of the Finance Strategy, however, decisions were taken on 12 February 2009 as part of the 2009/11 Revenue Budget to fully utilise this sum, and future reports will reflect these decisions.

#### 8.0 FINANCIAL STRATEGY

8.1 Each Policy & Resources Committee highlights other issues not included in projections which may impact on future revenue monitoring reports.

Issues to highlight in this report are as follows:

**Future Government Settlements** - It is becoming increasingly apparent that future settlements for Local Government from 2010/11 onwards are going to be very tight, with latest indication from the Government talking about minimal increases in cash resources which will mean in real terms, cuts in funding. The Financial Strategy is currently being reviewed in line with previous reports to Committee, and will be presented to the next Policy & Resources Committee in May 2009.

**Revenues Income** - Latest figures in respect of Council Tax and Non Domestic Rates income are indicating a slow down on receipts. This is in line with reports from other Councils, and this information is being reported to the Government via Cosla. At the moment, the reductions are not material, however, if this situation changes then Committee will be advised.

**Efficiency Target** - The Chancellor's budget statement will not be made now until late April 2009, and until this point in time the Council will not get an indication of the level of efficiency target for the year 2010/11. Members will recall that an estimate of £1.4 million was factored into the 2010/11 budget, and once a firmer figure is received from the Scottish Government then this will be reported to Members.

#### 9.0 IMPLICATIONS

9.1 There are no implications of a Legal, HR or an equalities' nature over and above those highlighted in the report.

#### 10.0 CONSULTATION

10.1 This report is being produced in consultation with the CMT who have endorsed its contents.
