Subject:	General Fund Revenue Budget 2 2009	2009/10 – Po	osition as at 31 July

## 1.0 PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of the report is to advise Committee of the latest position of the 2009/10 General Fund Revenue Budget as at 31 July 2009, and to provide an update in respect of earmarked reserves and other relevant matters.

## 2.0 SUMMARY

- 2.1 Appendix 1 shows that as at 31 July 2009 there is a projected underspend of £1,000,000 in the General Fund Revenue Budget arising from a projected overall underspend from Service Committee and savings in loans charges generated by debt restructuring carried out at the end of 2008/9 and the early part of 2009/10.
- 2.2 Overall Service Committees are projecting an underspend of £300,000. This is following a review of the Social Care Committee employee cost projection which identified an improved position of £328,000 since the Period 3 report.
- 2.3 Appendix 2 gives the position in respect of earmarked reserves as at 31 July 2009. It can be seen that expenditure is £3.646 million which represents 15% of projected expenditure for 2009/10.
- 2.4 Appendix 3 shows the projected position for the General Fund Reserve as at 31 March 2010 as being a balance of £6.327 million. Whilst this is £2.327 million greater than the recommended minimum level of non-earmarked General Fund Reserves a significant pressure is highlighted within the report in respect of the need to set aside funds to pay for further voluntary severance/early retrials arising from the anticipated reduction in the Council workforce over the next 2 3 financial years.
- 2.5 There are a number of significant outstanding financial issues awaiting clarification and resolution in respect of the 2010/11 Revenue Budget, and these are highlighted within Section 8 of the report.

## 3.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.1 It is recommended that the Committee note the current position of the 2009/10 General Fund Revenue Budget.
- 3.2 It is recommended that the Committee note the position in respect of the General Fund Reserve and the associated earmarked reserves.
- 3.3 It is recommended that the Committee agree to allocate a further £1.8 million from the General Fund Reserve to the Voluntary Severance/Early Retiral earmarked reserve, subject to this not bringing the projected non-earmarked reserves below £4.0 million as at 31 March 2010.

# 4.0 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 The Council agreed the 2009/11 Revenue Budget on 12 February 2009. This was the first two year budget agreed by the Council and included an estimated allowance for the Pre-Budget efficiency saving announced by the Chancellor in November 2008.
- 4.2 As part of the approved budget, the Council agreed the utilisation of general fund reserves with the result of reducing the non-earmarked General Fund reserve to £4 million by 31 March 2010.

# 5.0 2009/10 CURRENT POSITION

- 5.1 Appendix 1 shows that as at period 4 (31 July 2009) there is a projected underspend on the General Fund of £1,000,000. This underspend is generated by a projected Service Committee underspend of £300,000 and savings in loans charges arising from debt restructuring carried out at the end of 2008/9 and the early part of 2009/10.
- 5.2 Ongoing savings in respect of this restructuring will be factored into the 2010/11 and on budgets, however it should be noted that an element of this saving is a one off in nature due to the extremely low temporary borrowing rates which the Council can currently obtain.
- 5.3 Service Committees are projecting an underspend of £300,000 against a budget of £184.7 million. The position in respect of the Social Care Committee has improved by £328,000 from that reported to members of that Committee on 27<sup>th</sup> August. A review by both Social Work and Finance Services identified offsetting income streams which had not been factored into the Period 3 projections whilst action taken by Social Work management to reduce overtime has resulted in a significant reduction in overtime during Period 4.

# 6.0 EARMARKED RESERVES

6.1 It can be seen from Appendix 2 that expenditure on earmarked reserves in 2009/10 is £3.646 million which represents 15% of projected expenditure. Progress in expending earmarked reserves is reviewed by the CMT every month and by Service Committees each cycle.

# 7.0 GENERAL FUND RESERVES

- 7.1 Appendix 3 shows the projected position in respect of the General Fund Reserve as at 31 March 2010. It can be seen that based on the current projected underspend and the better than projected outturn for 2008/9 that the projected balance as at 31 March 2010 is £6.327 million. This is £2.327 million greater than the minimum level of non-earmarked General Fund Reserves recommended by the Chief Financial Officer.
- 7.2 A report elsewhere on the agenda advises that the remaining unallocated earmarked reserve fund balance in respect of early retiral/voluntary severance is £675,000 indicating that the Council has spent in excess of £1.2 million from this reserve over the last nine months. In light of this and after considering the fact that the Council will need to continue to reduce employee numbers in order to deliver balanced budgets for 2010/11 and 2011/12 it is recommended that a further £1.8 million be allocated to the early retiral/voluntary severance earmarked reserve. This will reduce the projected balance on the non-earmarked General Fund Reserve to £4.5 million as at 31 March 2010.

## 8.0 FINANCIAL STRATEGY

8.1 Each Policy and Resources Committee highlights other issues not included in the

projections which may impact on future revenue monitoring reports and future years' budgets. Issues to highlight in this report are as follows:

## **Future Government Settlements**

It is anticipated that the Scottish Government will announce Local Governments 2010/11 financial settlement in early November. Committee should note that it is expected that there will be a reduction in funding over and above that advised to Members when setting the 2009/11 revenue budget. However, it is not anticipated that Members will be required to reopen consideration of the 2010/11 budget.

## Pay Awards

The pay award for non-teaching employees for 2010/11 has not yet been agreed. The Council has budgeted for 2.5% within its 2010/11 budget, but given the current economic climate and the levels of pay award elsewhere it is anticipated that the final pay award for 2010/11 will be significantly lower than this sum. COSLA has given initial consideration to a pay strategy which will form the basis for the initial pay award discussions.

## Fairer Scotland Fund

From 2010/11 the current Fairer Scotland Fund Grant will become part of the General Revenue Grant for the Council. The Council will need to await details of the overall 2010/11 settlement before deciding how much funding is allocated to delivery of outcomes formerly funded by FSF. In the interim proposals are being developed to optimise the impact of sums allocated to areas covered by this funding.

## Carbon Accounting

From 2010/11 all major users of electricity and gas will have to participate in a carbon accounting trading scheme developed by the UK Government. At present there is a significant volume of guidance issued, and this is supported by a number of seminars being delivered by the Government and COSLA. In simple terms, the aim of the carbon accounting scheme is to reduce the carbon footprint of large organisations, such as Inverclyde Council, and it is intended that this will be achieved through a carbon allowance trading scheme backed up by penalties for authorities that exceed their quota of carbon allowances. This has the potential to result in costs for the Council, and further details will be brought back to the appropriate Committee once they have been developed.

## Future Operating Model

The Policy and Resources Committee on 14 May considered a report in respect of the first stages of the Future Operating Model. It is clear that the Future Operating Model will have an impact on the strategic finances of the Council in coming years, and as a result a report is due to be prepared for the next meeting of the Policy & Resources Committee providing further detail in this regard.

## 9.0 IMPLICATIONS

9.1 There are no implications of a Legal, HR or Equalities nature over and above those highlighted in the report.

## **10.0 CONSULTATION**

10.0 This report is being produced in consultation with the CMT who have endorsed its contents.
