Subject: Update on School Leaver Destination Results for 2008-09

#### 1.0 PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide members with an update on the school leavers destination results for the academic year 2008-09.

#### 2.0 SUMMARY

- 2.1 Skills Development Scotland (SDS) supplies information on the destinations of school leavers (SLDR), at an individual level, to the Scottish Government's Education Analytical Services Division. The return is based on a follow up of young people who left school between the 1st of August 2008 and the 31st of July 2009.
- 2.2 The exercise was carried out during the month of September 2009 and produces a snapshot of destinations as at the 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2009. Therefore, on leaving school an individual could have taken up employment but by the 2<sup>nd</sup> October had become unemployed seeking. In the SLDR this individual would be recorded as being unemployed seeking. In addition a young person marked as unemployed may well have moved on to a positive destination since the end of the survey. There is a follow up exercise carried out in March 2010 to check sustainability of these individuals.
- 2.3 The positive destinations for Inverclyde Secondary schools in 2008-09 are 89.9% compared to 91.3% for 2007-08. Skills Development has also supplied the individual pupil destination for each leaver from the former Secondary school.
- 2.4 Inverclyde is ranked 6<sup>th</sup> out of 32 Local Authorities in 2008-09 compared to 6<sup>th</sup> in 2007-08. Inverclyde has overtaken Western Isles in terms of a positive school leaver percentage but Aberdeenshire has taken that place, leaving Inverclyde's position unaffected at 6<sup>th</sup>.
- 2.5 A comparison of the main points from the statistics between 2008-09 and 2007-08 is in the background section of this report.
- 2.6 A breakdown of destinations for each Inverclyde School is attached as Appendix 1.

Skills Development Scotland (SDS) supplies information on the destinations of school leavers (SLDR), at an individual level, to the Scottish Government's Education Analytical Services Division. This return is based on a follow up of young people who left school between the 1st of August 2008 and the 31st of July 2009. The exercise was carried out during the month of September 2009 and produces a snapshot of destinations as at the 2nd October 2009. The data has undergone a robust matching & validation process. Only leavers from publically funded secondary schools, who will be included in the Scottish Government's publication: Destinations of Leavers from Scottish Schools: 2008/09, are included in the analysis below.
