Subject: Community Investment Fund (CIF)

## 1.0 PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this report is to update Members on the expenditure of the Community Investment Fund (CIF) and to seek their approval to allocate the remaining balance to the proposed Visitor Centre for Lunderston Bay.

# 2.0 SUMMARY

- 2.1 The CIF was established by the Council in early 2007 and was meant to provide funds for various community initiatives throughout all the Wards in Inverclyde.
- 2.2 The number of often small projects being funded has made the overall management of the fund extremely difficult and over complicated at times.
- 2.3 The projects to be funded have also been changed over the years adding to the difficulties of spending / managing the fund.
- 2.4 Most projects have now been satisfactorily completed but one major project is still outstanding and now needs additional funding.

# 3.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.1 Members are asked to note the progress of the CIF and to agree to allocate the balance (currently estimated at £74,681) to the project at Lunderston Bay.
- 3.2 Members are asked to allocate £25,000 of uncommitted Reserves within Safe and Sustainable Communities to the Lunderston Bay project.

### 4.0 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 The CIF was established in early 2007 and initial suggestions from the Members led to the fund (originally £1.5 million) being targeted at 4 workstreams, i.e. Support for the Environment, Support for Sport, Support for Play and Support for Council Activities, covering some 22 individual projects.
- 4.2 Most of these projects are now complete (see Appendix 1) with a balance of £74,681 remaining.

- 4.3 Members of this Committee will be aware that there is an allocation of £150,000 out of CIF for the proposed Visitor Centre at Lunderston Bay. This project can only go ahead with additional funding from the Council due to technical difficulties over disposal of waste water from that site. The solution to these difficulties has been estimated, at an additional £100,000 minimum.
- 4.4 The CMT have discussed this position and recommends that the CIF balance be used to offset any additional costs for the Lunderston Bay project.

### 5.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 Members will see from appendix 2 how the balance of £74,681 is achieved.
- 5.2 There is also an available balance of £25,000 in uncommitted Reserves within Safe and Sustainable Communities. The CMT recommends that this £25,000 also be given over to the Lunderston Bay project.

### 6.0 CONSULTATION

6.1 The report has been produced in consultation with all the project officers with responsibility for managing projects being funded out of CIF.

# 7.0 EQUALITY POLICY

7.1 The report has been written in line with the Council's equality agenda.
