Subject: Green Charter Action Plan	

1. PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this report is to present the Green Charter Action Plan, attached as an APPENDIX Appendix, for approval and request permission to submit future updates on progress against the Plan to the Green Charter and Environment Group.

2. SUMMARY

- 2.1 The Council devised its Green Charter in October 2008.
- 2.2 In November 2008, the Green Charter Officer/Member Working Group was created to oversee the implementation of the Charter.
- 2.3 The Green Charter Action Plan is presented for Members' approval.

3. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 3.1 It is recommended that the Committee:
 - a. approves the Green Charter Action Plan; and
 - b. agree that future progress reports against the Plan be remitted to the Green Charter and Environment Group.

4. BACKGROUND

4.1 In October 2008, Members approved the Council's first Green Charter and associated Min Ref: governance arrangements.

- 4.2 A Green Charter Officer/Member Working Group was set up to oversee the implementation of the Charter and, at its meeting on 24 June 2009, the Group agreed to also act as the Delivery Group for Single Outcome Agreement Outcome 8: Environment. In light of its dual role, the Group was later renamed the Green Charter and Environment Group.
- 4.3 Chaired by the SOA 8 Outcome Lead, an SOA 8 Sub-Group was created in March this vear to develop, monitor, evaluate and report on the SOA Environment Delivery Plan. The Green Charter Action Plan is an action included within the SOA Environment Delivery Plan.
- 4.4 It is proposed that future reports on progress against the Green Charter Action Plan are presented to the Green Charter and Environment Group on a six-monthly basis.

5. FINANCIAL INFORMATION

5.1 The Green Charter budget is £50,000 and spend will be contained within this figure.

6. IMPLICATIONS

6.1 The promotion of environmental initiatives is a priority of the Community Plan 2008/18, the Single Outcome Agreement 2009/11 within Outcome 8: Environment and the Corporate Plan 2007/11 within Strategic Outcome 3: Safe, Sustainable Communities.
