**Subject:** Community Facilities Grant

# 1.0 PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this report is to update Committee on progress of the administration and disbursement of the Community Facilities Fund of £1, 200,000.

## 2.0 SUMMARY

- 2.1 The Regeneration Committee on 28<sup>th</sup> October 2010, approved procedures for allocation of the Community Facilities Grant and the Corporate Director, Regeneration and Environment subsequently implemented phase 1 of the programme in accordance with the proposed uses and criteria.
- 2.2 Following local publicity, a total of 48 expressions of interest had been received by the closing date of 1<sup>st</sup> February 2011. Those organisations were invited to submit full applications including an appropriate Business Plan by the closing date of Friday 29<sup>th</sup> April 2011.
- 2.3 A total of 14 full applications were subsequently received, assessed and scored according to the appropriate criteria. The recommendations for approval are as listed at appendix 1.

#### 3.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.1 The Committee is asked to note the progress made with the Community Facilities Grant.
- 3.2 The Committee is asked to approve the recommendations at appendix 1.
- 3.3 The Committee is asked to delegate authority to the Corporate Director Regeneration and Environment for the disbursal of funds in accordance with the procedures of Inverclyde Council and to implement appropriate monitoring procedures.

#### 4.0 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 The Community Facilities Fund was established at full Council in February 2010 to support the development of community facilities across Inverclyde. The fund was approved for the following purposes:-
  - · community facilities
  - play and recreational facilities
  - community allotments
  - other facilities which contribute to the well being of the local community.
- 4.2 Following appropriate publicity, 48 organisations submitted an initial expression of interest. Subsequently, these organisations were issued application packs and invited to submit their completed bids by the closing date of Friday 29<sup>th</sup> April 2011.
- 4.3 All organisations were given further information and offered support through officers of Inverclyde Council if required for the completion of their bids. Specifically, applicants were advised that their submissions must fit with the following eligibility guidelines:-
  - Applications are welcome from local community, voluntary and third sector organisations.
  - The grant request must not exceed 75% of the total project costs
  - Applicants are required to demonstrate the availability and extent of external match funding.
  - Successful applicants are required to submit details of all costs incurred and secure tenders adopting current and appropriate procurement processes.
  - Provide progress/monitoring reports over the duration/life cycle of the project.
- 4.4 By the closing date, a total of 14 bids had been received. These were then scored and assessed by appropriate officers of Inverclyde Council, using the following criteria and weightings:-

Criteria	Weighting
Business Plan/Finance	70%
Evidence of need and community benefit	10%
Sustainability	10%
Accessibility and equality	10%

4.5 Further evaluation of completed applications was made by the SOA2 group who have considered and approved the officer recommendations before seeking final approval from the Regeneration Committee.

### 5.0 PROPOSAL

- 5.1 Subject to Committee approval, all applicants will be notified of the outcome as soon as possible after 1<sup>st</sup> September, to allow time for project activity to commence.
- 5.2 All successful applicants will be required to comply with procedures for the monitoring of finance and performance including the submission of regular reports at a timescale to be agreed dependent on the nature of the project.
- 5.3 All payments will be made in arrears on evidence of expenditure that is incurred and defrayed.

- 5.4 All monitoring of finance and performance will be completed by the existing team based within the Economic Development Programme Management Support Unit (PMSU).
- 5.5 Should funding be available for this purpose, then Phase 2 will commence in accordance with agreed Inverciyde Council procedures.
