Subject:	Safe, Sustainable Communities Capital Progra	amme 2011/15	- Progress

1.0 PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this report is to update Committee in respect of the status of the projects forming part of the Safe, Sustainable Communities Committee Capital Programme and to highlight the overall financial position.

2.0 SUMMARY

- 2.1 This report advises Committee in respect of the progress and financial status of the projects within the Safe, Sustainable Communities Capital Programme.
- 2.2 It can be seen from the table in 6.2 that the projected spend over 2011/15 is £26.557m which means that the total projected spend is on budget.
- 2.3 Expenditure is currently 64% of 2011/12 projected spend and slippage of £1,470,000 (20.33%) is currently reported. Slippage has increased by £428,000 since the previous report. This movement is mainly due to £172,000 within Flooding Strategy; £171,000 within Play Areas; £80,000 for Baker Street Land Acquisition; £75,000 within the Zero Waste Fund; and £48,000 within Knocknairshill Phase 5c; partly offset by a further increase in expenditure of £150,000 within the additional Roads Improvements funding.

3.0 **RECOMMENDATION**

3.1 The Committee note the current position of the 2011/15 Capital Programme and the progress on specific projects detailed in Appendix 1.

4.0 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 In February 2011 the Council agreed a three year Capital Programme covering the period 2011/14. The Government has subsequently announced 2014/15 Capital Grant allocations and in February 2012 the Council agreed both to extend the Capital Programme to include financial year 2014/15 and to fund a number of additional Capital projects from available reserves.
- 4.2 In addition to these projects which have been added to the programme further funding for Roads (£1m for Flooding & £2.2m for Roads/Footways & Lighting Investment) was agreed but is dependent on Government confirmation that funds currently set aside for the Landfill Tax Penalty Scheme will not be required. These projects will be added to the programme on confirmation that the funding is available.

5.0 PROGRESS (Major Projects)

Additional funding of £1million was allocated towards Road Improvements from Revenue Reserves in September 2011. It is currently projected that £750,000 of this will be spent in the current financial year.

- 5.1 This is £150,000 more than previously reported due to the Service progressing works quicker than originally estimated. This has been partly due to there being fewer delays than expected as a result of the mild winter. A further £1.4m additional funding from Reserves was awarded in February 2012 and has been allocated to 2012/13.
- 5.2 As previously reported, uncertainty over the future workload for Building Services is likely to affect the future fleet requirements. Once the implications are confirmed the programme will be reviewed and as a result of this £382,000 has slipped into 2013/14 until this has been resolved. 2014/15 sees the first year of the next cycle of the Vehicle Replacement Programme, a budget of £950,000 has been allocated for this.
- 5.3 Phase 5c of the development of Knocknairshill Cemetery was due to conclude in late 2011. The works were delayed due to the original contractor going into administration and a new procurement process having to be entered into in order to appoint a new contractor to undertake the balance of the works. The contract for the works has been awarded and works will now be concluded in May 2012. Based on the tendered price there will be an under spend on the works amounting to £70,000. The Service is currently developing proposals for cemetery expansion in Inverclyde which will be the subject of future reports to the Corporate Management Team and thereafter to the Safe, Sustainable, Communities Committee. £127,000 has been slipped to 2012/13 until such times as these proposals are finalised and agreed.
- 5.4 As previously reported, an underspend of £106,000 has been identified within the Flooding Strategy mainly due to lower than anticipated tender returns. This has slipped into 2012/13 until such times that further Flooding proposals have been developed and approved. A further £172,000 requires to be carried forward, mainly due to a delay in SEPA granting a licence for construction works at Woodstock Road and Auchmountain Glen which they have indicated could take up to 4 months. Consultants have been commissioned to design a long term solution and effective drainage system at Dunrod Road. This has closed due to flood damage caused by the severe weather experienced in November.
- 5.5 £95,000 of funding for Bridge Strengthening has slipped into 2012/13 due to a delay in preparing tender documents
- 5.6 Within Play Areas, £171,000 has been carried forward to 2012/13 because some of the projects will not be completed until early in the new financial year, due in part to an extended lead time for equipment manufacture. A further £75,000 will be carried forward to 2013/14 due to the amended date of a Lottery application by Greenock Central Residents Action Group. The original bid submission date was February 2012, but has now been revised to August 2012, which means that some of the works may not take place until 2013/14. A further £300,000 of funding was agreed by the Council in February 2012 and has been provisionally allocated to 2012/13.

- 5.7 Although the Scheme of Assistance (SOA) budget will be fully committed by 31 March 2012, householders in receipt of a grant award have one year to draw down the funding. It is anticipated that not all grants will be expended in the current year and therefore, based on previous experience, it is estimated that £480,000 will be drawn down in the next financial year
- 5.8 Environmental Services were granted approval by this Committee on the 17 January 2012 for the implementation of a trial Glass Collection Scheme. £59,000 has been allocated from the Zero Waste fund to purchase containers, however, the procurement and delivery will not be completed this financial year and the £59,000 along with a further £16,000 for other works has been carried forward to 2012/13.

6.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 6.1 The figures in Appendix 1 detail the position at 1 February 2012. Expenditure to date is £3.678m, which is 64% of the 2011/12 projected spend of £5.759m (Appendix 1).
- 6.2 The current 2011/15 budget is £26.557m, made up of £8.314m Supported Borrowing, £7.193m Prudential Borrowing, £5.875m of CFCR, £4.774m of Grant Funding and £0.401m of funding from external parties. The current projection is £26.557m which means the current projection is on budget.
