Subject: Former Safe, Sustainable Communities Capital Programme 2012/15 -

Progress

1.0 PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this report is to update Committee in respect of the status of the projects within the former Safe, Sustainable Communities Committee Capital Programme and to highlight the overall financial position.

2.0 SUMMARY

- 2.1 This report advises Committee in respect of the progress and financial status of the projects within the former Safe, Sustainable Communities Capital Programme.
- 2.2 It can be seen from the table in 6.2 that the projected spend over 2012/15 is £23.087m which means that the total projected spend is on budget.
- 2.3 Expenditure is currently 1.42% of 2012/13 projected spend with no slippage currently reported.
- 2.4 The Capital report reflects the Committee structures existing prior to the recent reorganisation. As the new Committee structures have been confirmed it is intended that a single, consolidated report will be presented to future Committee meetings.

3.0 RECOMMENDATION

3.1 The Committee note the current position of the 2011/15 Capital Programme and the progress on specific projects detailed in Appendix 1.

4.0 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 In February 2011 the Council agreed a three year Capital Programme covering the period 2011/14. The Government has subsequently announced 2014/15 Capital Grant allocations and in February 2012 the Council agreed both to extend the Capital Programme to include financial year 2014/15 and to fund a number of additional Capital projects from available reserves.
 - It should be noted that 2011/12 is now included in prior year spend and that the year end process is still ongoing and therefore the 2011/12 outturn is subject to change.
- 4.2 The Capital report reflects the Committee structures existing prior to the recent reorganisation. As the new Committee structures have been confirmed it is intended that a single, consolidated report will be presented to future Committee meetings.
- 4.3 In addition to these projects which have been added to the programme further funding for Roads (£1m for Flooding & £2.2m for Roads/Footways & Lighting Investment) was agreed but is dependent on Government confirmation that funds currently set aside for the Landfill Tax Penalty Scheme will not be required. These projects will be added to the programme on confirmation that the funding is available

5.0 PROGRESS (Major Projects)

- 5.1 Additional funding of £1million was allocated towards Road Improvements from Revenue Reserves in September 2011 and the actual spend to end of March 2012 is £993,000. This is £241,000 more that previously reported, due to the Service progressing works quicker than originally estimated. This has been partly due to there being fewer delays than expected as a result of the mild winter. A further £1.4m additional funding from Reserves was awarded in February 2012 and has been allocated to 2012/13. The Service is projecting that the full £2.8m allocation for 2012/13 will be fully spent by March 2013.
- 5.2 An additional £233,000 of funding within the Vehicle Replacement Programme has slipped into 2012/13. This is due to further utilisation assessments being carried out prior to any vehicle replacements. The Service is anticipating that full spend of the 2012/13 budget including this slippage will be achieved.
- 5.3 Phase 5c of the development of Knocknairshill Cemetery was due to conclude in late 2011. The works were delayed due to the original contractor going into administration and a new procurement process having to be entered into in order to appoint a new contractor to undertake the balance of the works. The works are currently being undertaken and expected to be concluded in May 2012. Based on the most recent valuation there will be an under spend on the works amounting to £69,000. The Service is currently developing proposals for cemetery expansion in Inverclyde which will be the subject of a future report to this committee. As previously reported £127,000 of funding from 2011/12 has slipped to 2012/13 until such times as these proposals are finalised and agreed.
- 5.4 In March 2012 the Council approved a proposed programme of projects for Flooding funded from the Roads Capital budget for 2012/15. This included £1m for match funding for the Flood Action Plan for 2012/13 2013/14 and beyond. This is dependent on Government confirmation that funds currently set aside for Land Fill Tax Penalty Scheme will not be required. This will be added to the programme on confirmation that the funding is available.
 - Culvert extensions at Hole Burn and Carts Burn are being delayed awaiting SEPA's decision to grant a CAR license to the Cartsburn. Until such decision is known, no change to previously reported budgets can be made.

- 5.5 £95,000 of funding for Bridge Strengthening carried forward from 2011/12 is currently out to tender and will be carried out in 2012/13.
- 5.6 Within Play Areas, £209,000 has been carried forward from 2011/12 into 2012/13, this is £38,000 more than previously reported. This is because some of the projects will not be completed until early in the new financial year, due in part to an extended lead time for equipment manufacture. A further £75,000 will be carried forward to 2013/14 due to the amended date of a Lottery application by Greenock Central Residents Action Group. The original bid submission date was February 2012, but has now been revised to August 2012, which means that the works will not take place until 2013/14. In addition, there are land ownership and servitude issues still to be resolved with Network Rail as the site of the proposed play area is situated directly over a railway tunnel. A further £300,000 of funding was agreed by the Council in February 2012 and has been provisionally allocated to 2012/13.
- 5.7 A further £310,000 of the Scheme of Assistance (SOA) budget slipped into 2012/13. Grant legislation provides a 12 month period in which to complete works and draw down the approved grant, with this 12 month period spanning financial years. Slippage in the Scheme of Assistance budget can be attributed to committed large scale works not being practically complete by year end and therefore not being eligible for grant payment by 31st March 2012.
- 5.8 As previously reported Environmental and Commercial Services has carried forward from 2011/12 £59,000 allocated from the Zero Waste fund for the implementation of a trial Glass Collection Scheme and the procurement and delivery of this will be carried out in 2012/13. The remaining 2012/13 budget will be split between the development and refurbishment of bring sites and recycling points and the ongoing maintenance of the Materials Recycling Facility.

6.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 6.1 The figures in Appendix 1 detail the position at 30 April 2012. Expenditure to date is £92,000, which is 1.42% of the 2012/13 projected spend of £6.478m (Appendix 1).
- 6.2 The current 2012/15 budget is £23.087m, made up of £5.650m Supported Borrowing, £8.150m Prudential Borrowing, £5.947m of CFCR, £3.114m of Grant Funding and £0.226m of funding from external parties. The current projection is £23.087m which means the current projection is on budget.
