In September 2014 officers were identified to join and support the Divisional Rape Investigation Unit to focus on live enquiries. These enquiries are often historical; limiting evidential opportunities and complex in nature; requiring specialised officers to carry out extensive investigation. However, significant progress has been made in a short period of time, with a number of cases being concluded and increasing the current detection rate at week 25 (22/09/14) to 45.2%.
