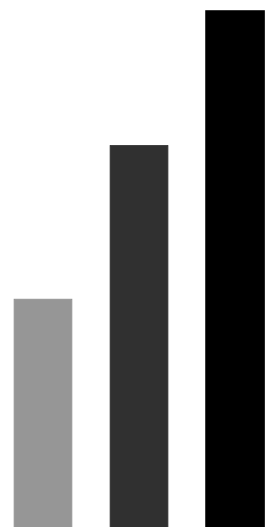

PURPOSE OF THIS REPORT

1. The purpose of this report is to inform the Scrutiny Sub-Committee members of Fire and Rescue performance and related activities during Quarter 3 of the 2015/16 reporting period.

PERFORMANCE

2. An SFRS performance report is attached as an Appendix to provide Elected Members with a Ward analysis performance report which relates to a range of Fire & Rescue operational activities within Inverclyde from 1 October 2015 to 31 December 2015.

The information provided in this report and Appendix continues to show reductions across a range of fire related performance indicators; however it also identifies those areas where further interventions are required in order to tackle those areas where operational demand is highest.

A summary of the report is detailed below:

- a. There were no fire fatalities within Inverclyde during the reporting period.
- b. There were 9 Non-fatal fire casualties (including precautionary check-up) within the reporting period which is an increase from 6 in the previous reporting period.
- c. Deliberate fire raising has reduced from 100 to 79 incidents. This is mainly due to a decrease in deliberate secondary fires from 79 incidents in the previous period to 67 in the current reporting period.
- d. There was an increase in the number of all accidental fires attended, from 32 in the previous reporting period to 39 incidents during the current reporting period.
- e. Special service activity levels remain static at 53 in this reporting period.
- f. The total number of false alarm incidents has increased slightly from 180 to 185 incidents in the current reporting period. The rise is due to an increase in the number of calls made by the public with good intention.

PRIORITIES & INTERVENTIONS

3. SFRS is committed to working in partnership with Community Planning partners in the public, private, and voluntary sectors in order to work together for a safer Scotland. Strengthening our relationship with and working in partnership to add value to our communities is critical to the success of our work.

The following activities are illustrative of SFRS activities in terms of educational activities and interventions:

- a. SFRS continues to work in partnership with Community Planning partners in order to further reduce the number of fire and other emergency incidents attended in Inverclyde. Our participation at the multi-agency tasking and coordinating (MATAC) meetings is one of the key ways in which we work with partners including Police and Community Safety Services to tackle fire related ASB issues including deliberate fire raising and malicious calls. The SFRS LALO position is now fully established with the officer attending weekly Community Safety Partnership meetings at West Stewart Street in a multi-agency approach with Police, Community Wardens and Housing colleagues to deal with ASB and operational matters within Inverclyde.
- b. Fire & Rescue officers participate and contribute at SOA thematic and other Multi-agency committees including the Alcohol & Drugs partnership (ADP), Adult Protection Committee(APC) and the Safer & Stronger theme- Successful Communities Partnership (SOA2)
- c. Home Fire Safety Visits (HFSV) are seen as a key way of preventing accidental house fires and reducing fire related injuries by fitting smoke alarms and providing fire safety advice to occupants. A total of 350 HFSV were delivered in Inverclyde by Fire crews in the reporting period
- d. Schools education – dedicated fire safety staff provide a range of educational visits and talks within educational establishments in order to promote fire safety to young people. The aim is to promote safety and change the culture which may lead to fewer deaths and injuries from fire and road traffic collisions in future generations.
- e. The Greenock Fire Museum and Heritage centre within the Old Fire Station which is part of Inverclyde Councils Municipal buildings continues to promote the history of the fire service and fire safety within Inverclyde to residents and visitors

LSO UPDATE

4. Area Manager Martin Gordon will soon be moving post from LSO of Inverclyde to a post within West Service Delivery Area based at Hamilton. Area Manager David Proctor will be appointed as LSO over Inverclyde, Renfrewshire and East Renfrewshire Local Authority Areas in the near future and he will attend future Scrutiny meetings to report to the Sub Committee.

RECOMMENDATIONS

5. Sub-Committee members are asked to note the contents of this report and appendix.

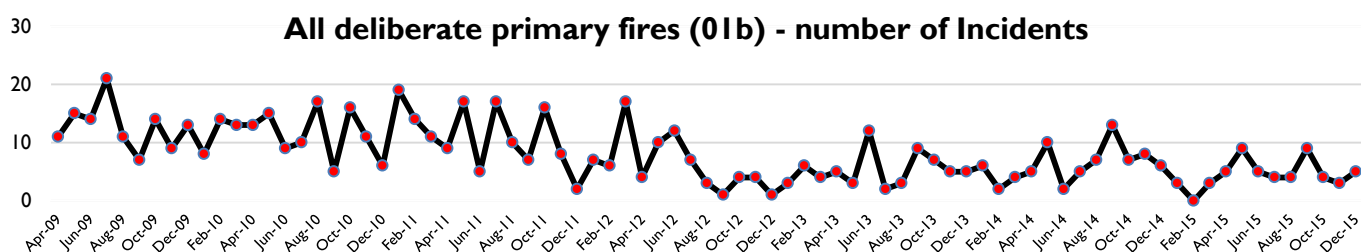

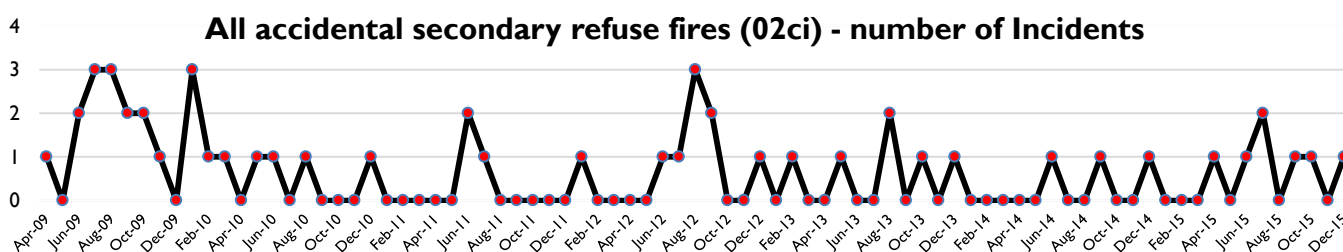

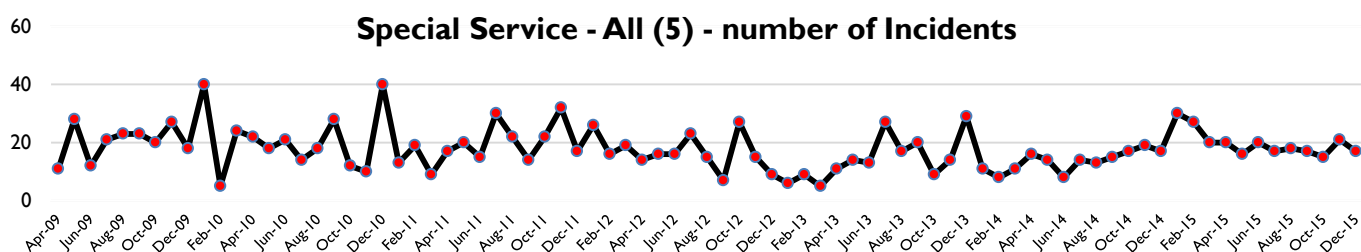

1. Background

The Police and Fire Reform (Scotland) Act 2012 sets out that the main purpose of policing is to improve the safety and well-being of persons, localities and communities in Scotland. It ensures an enhanced focus on local delivery of policing with a designated local commander for each local authority area accountable for local service provision. Each local commander is required to prepare a local policing plan that meets the needs of the local area and is approved by the local authority. In response to this the local authority has a statutory power to monitor the delivery of police services and to provide feedback to the local commander.

2. Inverclyde Local Police Plan

The Inverclyde Local Police Plan was published on 1st April 2014. This plan sets out the local policing priorities and objectives for Inverclyde for 2014 – 2017. It will be reviewed annually through ongoing consultation and is supported by 6 ward community policing plans.

3. Performance reporting to Inverclyde Council

The local commander is required to provide reports at an agreed timescale for scrutiny by elected members. Formal scrutiny of the Inverclyde Police Plan falls under the governance of the Inverclyde Police and Fire Scrutiny Sub Committee under the auspices of the Education and Communities Committee which meets a minimum of two times per year.

4. Recommendation

The following data is extracted from Police Scotland internal systems and is correct as of 2nd February 2016. The data is a year to date comparison with the previous year. It includes both recorded and detected crime data and covers all priority areas as set out in the local police plan. Members are asked to scrutinise policing performance for the period outlined and provide feedback where appropriate.

Plans may include high visibility patrols, static speeding checks or media publication to enhance driver behaviour. Our Divisional Roads Policing Department has hosted a number of events in Inverclyde this year offering safety advice and checks on vehicles which have been well attended by the public and our schools liaison officer and neighbourhood teams have incorporated road safety into their inputs to schools children. In March 2016 we will work with Inverclyde Council and other partners to commence a year-long Inverclyde Road Safety Campaign which will focus on all aspects of safety on our roads in order to encourage responsible and safe travel.

APPENDIX "A" - AUDIT METHODOLOGY

Audit 1 - Crime Related Incidents and Associated Recorded Crime

The audit sample was selected from Command and Control incidents over a specific four day period with initial call types CR-60 to CR-79 within the Crime category, and incidents with initial call types AB-57 Communications, AB-58 Hate Crime, PW-40 Domestic Incident and PW-76 Child Protection. The incident sample selected for audit ensured, working to a 95% confidence level with a confidence interval of +/-3%, that the sample audited was statistically representative of all incidents of this type recorded during the four day audit period. A formula was applied to the total number of incidents per Command Area and apportioned out between Divisions in that Command Area in order to obtain sample sizes. These were subject to a minimum of 150 and a maximum of 300 per Division.

Compliance in each of the two Tests is achieved with a result of **95%** or above.

The audit tested:

Test 1 – Crime Related Incidents

- That incidents initially inferring a crime or apparent criminal activity and closed as a non-crime contained a satisfactory narrative to eliminate any inference of criminality and fully justify a non-crime disposal.
- That each incident clearly indicated a crime or non-crime as a disposal on the incident text.
- Where an incident was closed as a crime, the corresponding crime record was traced.

Test 2 – Recorded Crime

- The correct application of SCRS on recorded crimes in respect of the Scottish Government Counting Rules and the correct classification of crimes. In terms of compliance with SCRS each individual crime over or under-recorded, or incorrectly classified was counted as having failed the audit.

Audit 2 - Recording of Specific Crime Types (Divisional Crime Audit)

To ensure that a number of different areas of crime recording are represented by Audit 2, samples were obtained from the following categories:

- Assault (Common Assault only)
- Group 1 Crime (Crimes of violence)
- Group 2 Crime (Sexual offences)
- Group 3 Crime (Crimes of dishonesty)
- Group 4 Crime (Damage to property)
- Other Crimes from Groups 5, 6 and 7

While not as statistically representative of all records within the audit period as Audit 1, the sample sizes in Audit 2 were weighted to take into account higher volumes of crime being recorded in some Divisions subject to a minimum of 100 records and a maximum of 300 records.

The audit tested the correct application of SCRS on recorded crimes in respect of the Scottish Government Counting Rules and the correct classification of crimes. In terms of compliance with SCRS each individual crime over or under-recorded, or incorrectly classified was counted as having failed the audit.

Compliance in this audit is achieved with a result of **95%** or above.

Audit 3 - Crime Records Reclassified to "No Crime"

The third principle of SCRS states "once recorded, a crime will remain recorded unless there is credible evidence to disprove that a crime had occurred".

The audit tested the correct application of this principle in respect of recorded crime which was reclassified to "No Crime" following Police enquiry into the reported circumstances. In terms of compliance with SCRS each individual crime reclassified incorrectly was counted as having failed the audit.

The sample sizes in Audit 3 were weighted to take into account the higher number of records reclassified to "No Crime" in some Divisions subject to a minimum of 50 and a maximum of 100.

Compliance in this audit is achieved with a result of **95%** or above.

In order to allow Divisions a reasonable period of time to ensure that records are complete and compliant with SCRS, audits are generally undertaken once a period of three months from the date of the incident/crime has elapsed. Any record incomplete at the time of audit will be audited based on the information available at the time.

APPENDIX B

We strongly support other agencies in educating and diverting young people away from engaging in risky behaviours and offering reassurance to the wider community. Some of the activities we have been involved with over the last few months include:

- FAST (Save the children project – Families and Schools Together). Our neighbourhood officers in ward 4 have recently concluded an 8 week project with families at Lady Alice PS to promote wellbeing and help children reach their potential. The national project was embraced by the school who invited the officers to be part of the wider peer mentoring group given their already established involvement with the school. The feedback from the culmination event was extremely positive for those taking part and police involvement helped promote a real sense of community for the officers and families involved.
- Jump2it – a basketball initiative run by Glasgow Rocks, professional basketball team to encourage healthy lives, tackle knife crime and help children grow in confidence. Officers have been involved in supporting coaching sessions and the inter schools tournament and will be present at the national event.
- HIDDEN – an urban arts project run by the Beacon Centre for 12 -26 year olds. In addition to workshops and bespoke projects, a learning pack for young people called 'One Stupid Mistake' has been created and will be rolled out in the coming months to the Izones with discussions to widen this to local secondary schools.
- SHELTERED HOMES – our roads policing and neighbourhood teams are currently visiting the local sheltered housing complexes to offer a range of road and personal safety advice and offer reassurance to residents and staff.
- FOOTBALL COACHING – neighbourhood officers were asked to assist with coaching one of the primary school teams. They often do this in their own time. They have also recently started coaching sessions with the Syrian and Afghan families now living within our communities. This is in conjunction with the SFA diversity team and will hopefully lead onto some of the group becoming involved in local teams.
- INVERCLYDE ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN – we are working alongside our colleagues in Inverclyde Road Safety and Schools to kick off a year- long Inverclyde Road Safety Campaign in March 2016. The intention is to better educate all road users in safe and considerate road use. Through a combination of events including an Older Persons Road Safety Awareness Day planned for May 2016 and co-ordinated enforcement throughout Inverclyde we plan to keep Road Safety a high priority in Inverclyde.
- NO KNIVES BETTER LIVES- officers from Inverclyde attended the NKBL 2016 Conference on 22nd March at Hampden Park where they participated in workshops and exercises with partners from Inverclyde and across the country sharing best practise.
