PROPOSED TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER -

UNION STREET, GREENOCK (18 TONNE WEIGHT RESTRICTION)

ORDER 2016

1.0 PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of the report is to introduce the Traffic Regulation Order – Union Street, Greenock (18 Tonne Weight Restriction) Order 2016.

2.0 SUMMARY

2.1 It is considered necessary to make the above Order to avoid danger to persons and other traffic using the road.

3.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.1 That the Committee recommend to The Inverclyde Council the making of the Traffic Regulation Order Union Street, Greenock (18 Tonne Weight Restriction) Order 2016 and remit it to the Head of Environmental and Commercial Services and Head of Legal and Property Services to arrange for its implementation.
- 3.2 The Committee is asked to note that, if approved, the Order may not be implemented until the making of the Order has been advertised to allow any persons who so wish a period of six weeks to question the validity of the Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

Legal and Property Services

4.0 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 Local Authorities are empowered to make Orders under the Road Traffic Regulation and Roads (Scotland) Acts 1984 and under the Council's Scheme of Administration the Environment and Regeneration Committee is responsible for the making, implementation and review of Traffic Management Orders and Traffic Regulation Orders.
- 4.2 Structure No. 27/1 carries Union Street over a disused rail line and is in the ownership of the Highways Agency Historical Railways Estate.
- 4.3 There is an existing weight restriction Traffic Regulation Order on this structure: "The Inverclyde Council Union Street, Greenock (7.5 Tonne Weight Restriction) Order 2014".
- 4.4 As a result of a recent structural inspection the load carrying capacity of the structure has been assessed as 18 tonnes.

The Inverclyde Council in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Sections 1(1) and 2(1) to (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Police Scotland in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act hereby make the following Order:

- 2. In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-
 - "Vehicle" unless the context otherwise requires, means a vehicle of any description and includes a machine or implement of any kind drawn or propelled along roads whether or not by mechanical power.
- 3. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle exceeding 18 Tonnes Maximum Gross Weight (m.g.w) on the length of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- 4. The Weight Restriction currently in force and specified in Schedule 1 annexed to this Order is hereby revoked.
