**Subject:** TAXI FARES REVIEW 2016

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## 1.0 PURPOSE

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to ask the Board to determine the taxi fare scales and charges following its annual review.
- 1.2 At its meeting on 10 August 2016, the Board considered the results of the informal consultations carried out as to what changes, if any, were required to the existing taxi fare scales. This report advises members of the results of the statutory consultation exercise.

## 2.0 RESULT OF CONSULTATIONS

- 2.1 At its meeting in August, the Board, following consideration of the papers before it decided to adopt the scale of taxi fares and other charges set out in the tariff card **Appendix 1** to this report.
- 2.2 Members are asked to note that the costings for the first additional miles in each tariff are described as approximate and should not be seen as an essential part of the fare scales.
- 2.3 It should be noted, further, that the tariffs set out by the local authority are the maximum fares that may be charged by the operators of taxis within Inverclyde.
- 2.4 The proposed taxi fares scales and charges were duly advertised and objections and representations were to be invited within the statutory period of one month following the date of advertisement.
- 2.5 Inverclyde Taxis Limited on behalf of ABC Taxis (Inverclyde) Ltd and the Operators Liaison Group lodged an objection to the proposal on 12 September 2016, a copy of which forms **Appendix 2** to this report.

## 3.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.1 That the Board note the objection to the proposal.
- 3.2 That the Board determine the taxi fare scales and charges following the annual review and that it be remitted to the Head of Legal & Property Services to make the necessary arrangements to implement the new taxi fare scales.

4.2 The Board should note that the Licensing authority must fix scales for the fares and other charges mentioned in subsection (1) of the 1982 Act within 18 months beginning with the date on which the scales came into effect. Section 18 of the Civic Government (S) Act 1982 allows taxi operators to lodge appeals against the local authority's decision in setting fares. Any appeals are lodged with the relevant traffic commissioner. If a taxi operator wishes to appeal the new fares, he must lodge his appeal within 14 days after the decision has been made.

**Re: Published Review of Taxi Fares & Charges 2016**

Further to the publication of the Review of Taxi Fares & Charges 2016, printed in the Greenock Telegraph on the 17<sup>th</sup> August 2016, please accept this letter as the response on behalf of Inverclyde Taxis Ltd, ABC Taxis (Inverclyde) Ltd and the Operators Liaison Group (hereinafter ITL, ABC and OLG respectively).

We are objecting to the published review of Taxi Fares & Charges 2016.

The grounds of our objections are as follows:

1. No consideration was given to the proposal submitted by ITL, ABC & the OLG dated the 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2016. At the General Purposes Board Meeting of 10<sup>th</sup> August 2016, no questions were asked of our detailed proposals. We acknowledge & accepted the opportunity to speak at the start of the item, but no questions were asked of our proposal by any of the Board. The sole focus of the General Purpose Board were the proposals submitted by the Head of Environmental & Commercial Services at Inverclyde Council. Under Section 17 (3) (c) of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, Licensing Authorities are required to consider such representations duly lodged with them. This does not appear to have happened given that no questions were asked of us at the meeting and therefore no consideration of our proposal took place.
2. What justification is there for the Council to invite the Head of Environmental & Commercial Services at Inverclyde Council to submit proposals for the Taxi Fare Review? Referring to Section 17 (3) (a), of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, the Licensing Authority is required to consult with persons or organisations appearing to them to be representative of operators of taxis. The Head of Environmental & Commercial Services does not fall under this category. Section 17 (3) (b) (ii) of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 permits any person to lodge representation regarding the Review of Taxi Fares. However, this would not apply to the Head of Environmental and Commercial Services as this post holder is directly employed by Inverclyde Council and therefore this constitutes a conflict of interest as there is an employer-employee relationship with the Head of Service representing the views of the Licensing Authority as an employee rather than a "person" submitting their views on the fare review.
3. The article published in the Greenock Telegraph on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2016, Appendix A, clearly demonstrates in the wording of the article that the decision had already been made prior to the General Purposes Board Meeting of the 10<sup>th</sup> of August 2016. Comments made in the article refer to Council Officers stating that the proposal submitted by the trade is "unfair". Gerry Malone is quoted in

the article as stating that “the proposals put forward by the trade disproportionately affect passengers taking a longer journey”. Whilst the Licensing Authority has a duty under Section 17 (3) (b) (i) to highlight the general effect of the proposals, Inverclyde Council has deliberately created a negative spin on the trade proposals by the use of the words “unfair” and “disproportionately”. A fair and balanced representation would be to state that a 1 / 5 / 10 mile journey would cost x under proposal A and cost y under proposal B. I note that Inverclyde Council failed in this article to comment on the trade proposal not to increase the flag fall to the benefit of those on low incomes, benefits and pensions who use Taxis for short journeys less than a mile, yet the proposal drafted and adopted by the General Purposes Board of Inverclyde Council advertised on the 17<sup>th</sup> August 2016 would impact these groups. It is our opinion that this article negatively influenced the General Purposes Board we would respectfully request a reassessment of the review.

4. The proposals submitted by the Head of Environmental & Commercial Services, on invitation from the Licensing Authority, made reference to the Consumer Price Index as justification for the increases in the Licensing Authorities 2 proposals. This proposal failed to take account of the increasing costs enforced by the Licensing Authority on a Taxi / Private Hire Operator. This is therefore an unbalanced and unfair view for the justification in their proposals.
5. The proposals submitted by the Head of Environmental & Commercial Services on behalf of the Licensing Authority failed to account for the fact that Inverclyde Council increased wages by 23% with the adoption of a National Living Wage of £8.25 per hour (up from £6.70). Given that the Council are required to set Taxi and Private Hire Fees to cover the cost of administration in specific relation to Taxi and Private Hire Licensing, can the General Purposes Board guarantee that Taxi and Private Hire Fees will not be increased in April 2017 to cover this additional expenditure in wages by the Licensing Authority?
6. Other Licensing Authorities when conducting their Fare Reviews, as required by the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, only deal with those views/proposals submitted by persons or organisations appearing to be representative of the Operators of Taxis or other lay persons who may submit a view or representation. Other Licensing Authorities do not invite themselves to submit their own views/proposals. Relevant authorities to this are the neighbouring authorities of West Dunbartonshire and Renfrewshire. Why are Inverclyde Council permitted to submit and accept their own proposal? Surely this is a conflict of interest and therefore unfair on the Taxi / Private Hire Trade.
7. We refer to Appendix B, National Fares Table September 2016, PHTM, Trade Publication, and respectfully request that the General Purposes Board Comment on this chart and furthermore accept and therefore endorse the proposal submitted by the Trade as being either equal to or less than the national average of Taxi/Private Hire fares for Scotland

Further to this, we also welcome the acceptance and comments of the General Purposes Board, that Inverclyde Council is 7th from bottom in the league table of Fares for Scottish Authorities.

8. The Licensing Authority have declined to comment on the national living wage claim of Taxi / Private Hire Drivers given the self employed nature of the trade. However, why do the Licensing Authority therefore request Taxi/Private Hire Drivers & Taxi/Private Hire Operators to submit their National Insurance numbers in their applications for the respective licenses? Any claims to assist in the identification of the applicant are negligible given that the Licensing Authority has been doing this without issue for a great number of years. Given that the trade is at the mercy of the Licensing Authority regarding the maximum fares that can be charged, why can the trade therefore not request an increase which would give Operators and Drivers an opportunity to earn the National Living Wage or get closer to it. Inverclyde Council, in particular the leader of Inverclyde Council, have been very pro active in advertising the Council as an Accredited National Living Wage Employer and urging other local employers to follow suit. To go against or decline to comment on this claim for the Taxi and Private Hire Trade is a demonstration of double standards. Other self-employed industries can establish their own charges for their work. Surely the refusal of the Licensing Authority to comment on this goes against the public campaign of the Licensing Authority as an Accredited Living Wage Employer.

Further to our objections, we would welcome that the General Purposes Board review their decision of the 10<sup>th</sup> August and approve the proposal of the trade as represented by ITL, ABC and the OLG. For the avoidance of doubt, the proposal submitted on the 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2016 is as follows:

1. Tariff 1 – flag fall to be maintained, and propose a 10% reduction in yardage after 1,004 yards.
2. Tariff 2 – flag fall to be maintained, and propose a 10% reduction in yardage after 974 yards.
3. Tariff 3 – flag fall to be maintained, and propose a 10% reduction in yardage after 974 yards.
4. Tariff 4 – flag fall to be maintained, and propose a 10% reduction in yardage after the first mile.
5. Tariff 4 – The yardage on the subsequent charge on Tariff 4 (at present 102 yards) should be the same as Tariff 3 (at present 94 yards). At present, the yardage on Tariff 4 is greater than on Tariff 3. These should be the same otherwise the benefit which Tariff 4 was introduced to bring, will be lost.
6. Tariff 3 – This tariff should take effect from 10pm, with subsequent changes to other Tariffs to take account of this change in start time. The majority of Councils in Scotland permit the “nighttime” tariff to take effect from 10pm and Inverclyde should be the same.
7. Can we please have wording added at the bottom of the “NOTE OF TARIFF”, before the VAT comment, that journeys Starting or Ending outside of the Inverclyde Council district can be on Tariff 3. This has been requested by Operators who advise this used to be on the Tariff but disappeared.
8. Renfrewshire Council, on renewal of Licenses, permit Operators and Drivers to apply for a 3 year license at a discounted price (cost of 2 years). We are requesting that Inverclyde Council make this option available to Inverclyde Operators and Drivers on renewal of Licenses.

It is the general feeling of Taxi and Private Hire Operators and Drivers that the Licensing Authority has let the trade down by refusing to consider, or at the very least appear to not consider, and endorse our proposal. The current Licensing Authority proposal, as advertised on the 17<sup>th</sup> August 2016, does not justify the cost of the Meter Tariff Change for Operators.

We would welcome the opportunity and formally request a regular meeting with appropriate parties i.e. Chair, Vice Chair, Council Officers and trade personnel, to work in partnership on trade specific matters with the Licensing Authority.
